What are the main barriers to educational achievement?	Assessing the children has shown that those eligible for pupil premium are sometimes behind their peers academically. They are not as confident with their reading. They can find writing challenging. Maths confidence and ability levels are lower than some of their peers. Behaviour can be an issue in some cases.
How are we spending pupil premium grant allocation to address those barriers?	The pupil premium grant is primarily used at Oak Hill CE Primary School to provide these children with access to additional adult support. This support takes many forms depending on the needs of the children. This includes one to one time when needed and support with groups of children of a similar ability. We have also used some of the allocation to allow us to bring in some additional support with consultants to give support to specific learning or behavioural needs. Some of the allocation has been used to provide additional financial support to ensure children to have access to extra-curricular and residential activities.
How do we measure the impact of pupil premium?	We track our children thoroughly throughout the year. We utilize an online tracking system that teachers update weekly to monitor their progress directly against the learning objectives of the National Curriculum. As well as this we use the children's own independent work to ensure progress is being made and utilize tests every half term to help us track individual progress. Children with pupil premium funding are monitored separately via our tracking system to ensure funding is being spent effectively. As of February 2017 our Pupil Premium group of children are making slightly higher than expected progress thanks to the additional support that are receiving.
