

### Primary School Sports Funding - 2015-2016 Action Plan

As a school we will receive an estimated £8188 for the academic year 2015-2016.

We are committed to using the funding to enhance our PE / sport provision both within and beyond the curriculum and to add additional resources and equipment. Physical education is an important element of a child's education as it can enthuse and motivate pupils to fully develop a love of sport and exercise.

- Profile of sporting achievements and activities of our pupils is raised
