

# Friday Home Learning

## Pick and Mix

<p><b>Broad bean diary</b> In an empty jar, swirl a small amount of water around and then empty it. Make a piece of kitchen roll damp and then put it in the jar. Put the broad bean seed in the jar so it rests on the kitchen roll. Every few days, spray the bean and kitchen roll with a little water. Create a diary with diagrams and notes of your bean and how it grows.</p>	<p><b>Using your senses</b> Put some objects, such as a hairbrush, a tube of toothpaste, a packet of biscuits, an ice cream scoop, a packet of tissues and a wooden spoon into a bag. You will also need something to act as a blindfold. Use your senses to feel what is on the bag. Play with a partner and see who guesses most of the objects.</p>	<p><b>Create a rainbow!</b> Cut a sheet of kitchen towel into a rainbow shape. Felt tip the bottom of each end with the colours of the rainbow and put each end into a bowl of water. You should have a beautiful rainbow!</p>	<p><b>Bake some bread!</b> There is so much going on 'science wise' in bread baking. What job does the yeast do? Can you see the bubbles? Why does it rise like that? What is yeast? How much larger has your dough grown whilst it proved?</p>
<p><b>One cup of Lego challenge!</b> What can you build with just one cup of Lego?</p>	<p>Follow one of the recipes on the Class Dojo page from the 15<sup>th</sup> January. You could make playdough, edible blocks, slime, puffy paint or ice paints.</p>	<p><b>Has Spring sprung?</b> Look outside. Can you see how the trees and plants are changing? What flowers can you see? Draw a picture to show that spring is here</p>	<p><b>Garden/home treasure hunt!</b> Create a rainbow collage by collecting coloured materials from your garden or home.</p>
<p><b>Natural art</b> Collect a few leaves or petals from your garden. Place them between 2 pieces of paper or a piece of spare white material. Using a stone bash the leaves and petals through the paper. When you open up the paper or material what do you see?</p>	<p><b>Excellent electricity!</b> Make a list using words/ drawings to find all the things in your home that use electricity. If you could keep only one item which would it be? Why?</p>
