Letter to all churches from Bishop Rachel

It is with deep sadness that we hear the news of the Queen's death. As our sense of loss ripples out across the nation, commonwealth and world, we give thanks for a life well lived. Whether we met her in person, saw her from a distance, or simply encountered her in our homes in newspapers, on the radio or on screen, we knew her as our Queen. We also knew that her leadership and dedication to her people was rooted in her Christian faith.

As a follower of Jesus Christ the Queen embodied the call to love God and neighbour. And so in these days of sadness and sorrow may we reflect this same commitment in our homes, communities and nation, as the Queen said in her Christmas Day speech 1957 (*the first one to be televised*):

"Today we need a special kind of courage, not the kind needed in battle

but a kind which makes us stand up for everything that we know is right, everything that is true and honest. We need the kind of courage that can withstand the subtle corruption of the cynics so that we can show the world that we are not afraid of the future (Queen's Speech.)"

Our churches should be a place people can come for prayer and reflection as we give thanks for Queen Elizabeth II and pray for Charles, our new King, the Royal family and the life of our communities, nation and Commonwealth.

I ask that you keep your church doors open and share with your community that they are welcome to visit to say a prayer or light a candle.

An official book of condolence is available in the Cathedral for anyone who wishes to write a personal message. 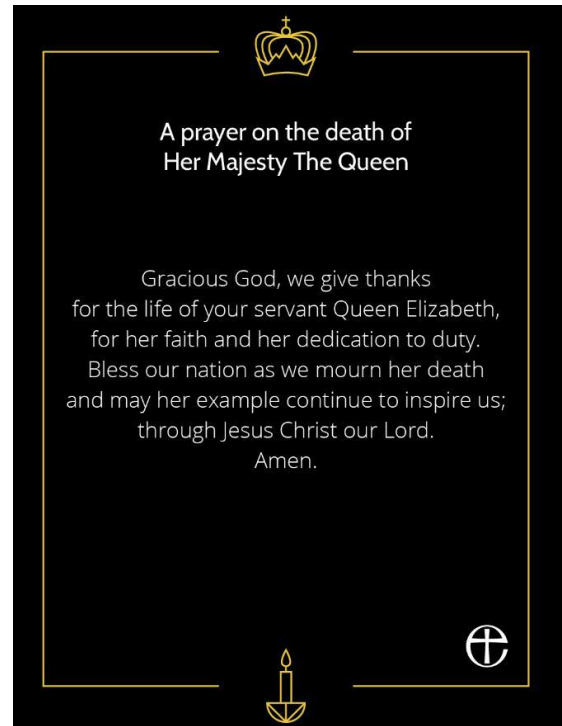

Class Names

To celebrate new changes and exciting futures, we have changed the names of the classes. Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are called Rowan, Year 3 and 4 are called Elm and Year 5 and 6 are called Redwood.

Rowan Class

What a fantastic first week we have had in Rowan Class! We have spent lots of time getting to know our new learning environment and where everything is. We have made new friends and got to know our new teachers. We started the week talking about our summer holiday adventures and wrote about this for our first independent write. We have also done lots of fun activities so that the teachers can get to know us! In Maths, we have begun our new unit of place value as well as working on our number recognition and formation. Year 2 have been recapping counting in 10s and matching the tens and ones to the two digit numbers. This week we also started our new PE unit and got to use the school hall for our lesson on balance.



Elm Class

Elm Class have worked creatively one afternoon to put their own, personal touch to a representation of Matisse's *The Snail* artwork. We have also begun a two-week study in English based upon the book 'The Wolves in the Walls' and learnt about the features of an ecosystem in the lead-up to our Science topic entitled 'Food and the Digestive System'.





Redwood Class

It was wonderful to welcome the children back into school on Tuesday and being able to show off all the hard work that has gone into the school over the summer holidays. During our first day as a class, we set the rules and expectations for our school year and the children also spent some time thinking about a personal goal they would like to achieve this year. The children will be focusing on working as a team this year, supporting each other both inside and outside of the classroom.

We started our History topic this week. Our topic is called Maafa and focuses on the African slave trade. The children started by exploring new topic specific vocabulary and then on Wednesday, with Mrs Kendall, they explored Africa. They were lucky enough to have a look at lots of beautiful items Mrs Kendall collected on her own African travels.

In Maths we are starting the year on number and place value. The children have worked with increasingly large numbers correctly identifying the place value of numbers up to 10 million.

In Science, we have started our unit on the circulatory system. We started looking at all the different systems that work to make our bodies function and the children then identified the key function of each and how they work together to keep us fit and healthy.

Our class reading book and focus for our VIPERS lessons is 'Freedom' by Catherine Johnson which this links closely to our topic and I can't wait to get stuck into it!
